# Nolin members making big changes in community

## Caring Nolin members contribute to Operation Round-Up



Nolin RECC members have voluntarily contributed thousands of dollars in a special account to help their community. These dollars began as small change through the Operation Round-Up (ORU) program at Nolin. Since implementing ORU in June 2006, more than \$120,000 has been donated to projects/agencies in our communities.

ORU allows the co-op members to voluntarily contribute quarters, dimes,

nickels, and even pennies into a special account that is used to help worthy causes in our community. Participants agree to have their electric bills rounded up to the next dollar, with the extra change dedicated to charitable causes and community projects.

Local citizens make up a nonprofit board of directors that governs ORU. The board reviews applications for community projects and makes decisions on when, where, and how to utilize funds.

ORU looks for special projects that will have a lasting value in the community.

The most recent contributions were presented at the Nolin RECC annual meeting June 27 at John Hardin High School. Altogether, more than \$10,000 was awarded to the Community Health Clinic of Hardin & LaRue Counties, Crossway Pregnancy Center, Rachel's Fun for Everyone Project, Girl Scout Troop 1080, Elizabethtown Cub Scout Pack 130, and CASA of the Heartland.

# Swimming Pools And Power Lines: A Dangerous Combination

**M**ost people installing a swimming pool think about price and quality—not the overhead and underground power lines. PLEASE, before you even begin to think about location, consider the safety of your family and friends. Power lines directly over pools are not allowed by Nolin RECC, and all other overhead lines must be no less than 15 feet from the inner edge of the pool. Underground wiring shall not be located under the pool or under the area extending 5 feet horizontally from the inside wall of the pool. We must all abide by the rules and regulations of the National Electric Safety Code. Members are responsible for relocating pools not in compliance with safety codes.

The best advice we can give you about pools is to call the Nolin RECC office before selecting a pool site. A swimming pool located too close to an electric line can result in potentially hazardous situations involving shock or even electrocution.
