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Nolin RECC responds to local outages, sends mutual aid after ice storm

In the very early hours of Thursday morning, Nolin RECC crews began responding to the first of the power outages caused by freezing rain that began falling on Wednesday. Crews worked for approximately 12 hours before the last of the outages in the Nolin service territory were restored. Over those 12 hours, a total of around 2600 Nolin members experienced a service disruption.

While still maintaining enough crews at home to respond to further outages, Nolin is sending 6 line technicians to fellow co-op Grayson RECC, in Eastern Kentucky near Morehead. Grayson was one of the co-ops in Kentucky to receive significantly more damage from the ice storm with over 8600 members out and damage to poles and lines.

“We send personnel to respond as mutual aid to co-ops around the region after events like hurricanes, and now one of our fellow Kentucky co-ops needs us. Our guys are glad to help wherever they can, but especially when it means they can be there for a sister co-op in Kentucky” says Nolin Communications Manager Sarah Fellows.

Nolin crews will arrive at Grayson RECC late this afternoon, it is unknown at this time how long they will stay.
