STAY SAFE DURING THE HOLIDAY AND BEYOND

Make your 4th of July holiday - and all summer - a safe one for your family by following some commonsense rules:

1. If fireworks are legal in your community and you choose to set them off yourself, keep them far away from power lines.
2. Keep an eye on your grill. Whether it's electric, gas or charcoal, do not leave a hot grill unattended, even for a few minutes. Its intense heat can easily harm children or pets. Plus, if flames are involved, you need to be there if they get out of control.
3. If you need an extension cord to plug in your grill or another cooking appliance, use a cord that is rated for the appliance and do not use that cord on more than one device at a time. Also, never plug extension cords into each other; they're not designed for that. They can overheat and cause a fire.



4. Keep the grill, blender, TV and other appliances away from the pool and from all water sources. Even if you're a safe distance away from the water, unplug the appliance as soon as you're finished using it.
5. Keep a working fire extinguisher on hand.




Charge and Save

If you own an EV, you may be eligible to participate in a new pilot program that provides monthly bill credits. Once approved for the program, your co-op will use the charging information to apply a monthly bill credit of \$.02 per kWh of off-peak charging completed by your EV while at home.
