NOTICE

Pursuant to the Kentucky Public Service Commission's ("Commission") regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8, Nolin Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation (RECC) gives notice that a tariff requesting approval to modify the terms and conditions of temporary service will be submitted to the Commission on August 1, 2024. If Nolin RECC's requests are approved, the tariff will be effective August 31, 2024, at which time the terms and conditions set below will be implemented for all new applicants requesting temporary service:

Nolin is removing some tariff language that allowed for an option to finance construction cost on three-phase services over a five-year period at a fixed interest rate defined in the tariff. This option was only identified in the tariff for three-phase service, was only listed on certain rate schedules, and the interest rate is not consistent with current interest rates.

A person may examine this tariff filing upon request at the Nolin RECC office located at 411 Ring Road, Elizabethtown, KY 42701. A person may also examine this tariff filing at the Commission's office located at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., or through the commission's website at http://psc.ky.gov. Comments regarding this tariff filing may be submitted to the Commission through its website at http://psc.ky.gov, or by mail to Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602. The terms and conditions contained in this tariff filing are the terms and conditions proposed by Nolin RECC, but the Commission may order terms and conditions that differ from the proposed terms and conditions contained in this tariff filing. A person may submit a timely written request for intervention in this tariff filing to the Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602, establishing the grounds for the request and including the status and interest of the person requesting intervention. If the commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of this notice, the Commission may take final action on the tariff filing.

Operation Round-Up


Grants totaling \$32,594 given back to the community in 2024
